

Alabama Energy Policy Issues and Updates:

- Alabama's newest residential energy code, based on the 2015 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC), took effect on October 1, 2016. While this is supposed to be a mandatory minimum, not all jurisdictions are currently enforcing it, and the ADECA Energy Division continues to work with local jurisdictions to make implementation and enforcement as consistent as possible statewide.
- In 2015, the Alabama Legislature approved commercial legislation enabling Property-Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) in Alabama. ADECA was recently appointed by an executive order to oversee PACE in Alabama and is researching administrative rules as well as the possibility of amending current legislation to include residential.
